





# Patterans

There are lots of ways that you could create and leave patterans (tracks, or markers) for other walkers. Choose one, and have a go!

TRACKING IS A WAY OF LEAVING TRACKS USING STICKS, STONES OR GRASS, SO THAT OTHERS BEHIND YOU CAN FOLLOW YOUR ROUTE. [CLICK HERE](#) FOR SOME TRACKING SYMBOLS YOU COULD CREATE ON YOUR WALK.

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YOU COULD CREATE A NATURE COLLAGE, WHERE YOU USE NATURAL MATERIALS YOU FIND ON YOUR WALK TO CREATE A PICTURE ON THE GROUND. MAKE SURE YOU ONLY USE NATURAL MATERIALS, SO YOUR PICTURE IS SAFE FOR ANY WILDLIFE THAT MAY FIND IT.

# Geocaching

Geocaching is like treasure hunting with a GPS! Your challenge is to navigate to the cache, and then solve a clue to find it! You don't need an actual GPS, you can put an app on your smartphone and use the built in GPS.

There are geocaches in lots of places, both in town centres and in the countryside, so there's a good chance that there is at least one on (or near) your chosen walk.

Some are relatively easy to find, some are really quite hard! Bear that in mind when choosing which cache(s) to look for.

There are some important ground rules when geocaching, to make sure that future geocachers aren't disappointed to discover that a cache is missing or damaged. They're on the next page - please make sure you observe them as you have fun geocaching.

# Geocaching rules

- Geocaches are usually waterproof containers, but they might be as large as a sandwich box or as small as a film canister (remember those?). There might be small treasures inside larger caches, which geocachers swap by taking something from the box and leaving something else. This is optional, but you should only take an item if you have something else to leave in return.
- If you leave an item for other geocachers, it should be safe. Treasures are supposed to be unique rather than expensive (like badges, souvenirs etc.), but you should also try not to take a higher value item and leave a lower value one.
- If there is a log book (or strip of paper in smaller caches), make sure you sign it! Part of the fun is to look back and see how many others have found it and where they were from.
- When you are ready to leave, make sure that you hide the geocache properly - put it back where you found it, or where the clue says that it is supposed to be, so that it's not found accidentally but future geocachers are able to find it.
- Make sure that you obey local laws and signs when finding your geocache - don't trespass on private land just to get to a cache.
- Geocachers jokingly refer to non-geocachers as 'muggles'. Watch out for muggles when you are searching, and be subtle or let them pass before you start hunting for the cache. They might think the cache is litter and get rid of it, or they could vandalise it or otherwise spoil the fun for future geocachers.

# Prayer Walk

Why not turn your walk into a prayer walk?  
You could pray for the people, homes and businesses that you see or the others who will walk your route.

Here are a few more ideas for ways you could pray on your walk - why not say a prayer when you see these things?

- Bench - pray for those who may sit on it
- Vehicles - pray for their drivers/riders and passengers and the purposes for which they may be travelling
- Emergency vehicles - pray for the staff in their work, the members of the public that they are serving, and the situation they are responding to
- School - pray for the students and staff
- Shops and restaurants - pray for the businesses, and thank God for the service they provide
- Farms and crop fields - pray for the farmer and their business, and thank God for the food that they produce
- Beautiful scenery - thank God for creation, and pray for the environment
- Litter - pray for the environment and for those who dropped the litter (we can bless them even if we don't like what they have done). And if it's safe to do so, pick up the litter!
